Sample and Methods


Married adults in village in the Terai region of Nepal

Census
Married adults (n= 959)
Households (n= 408)

Social Network Surveys
Baseline (n= 479)
Endline (n= 703)

Analytic Sample
 = 197

Statistical Analyses



Outcome: Time to Hoist Flag

Covariates: Household location, wealth, caste, baseline attitudes and norms, network centrality

Analysis: Cox proportional hazard of time to hoist

Early Hoister Characteristics

Less household wealth
More gender equitable attitudes
More central to social network

Time to Hoist Analysis

Increased centrality was associated with earlier flag hoisting
