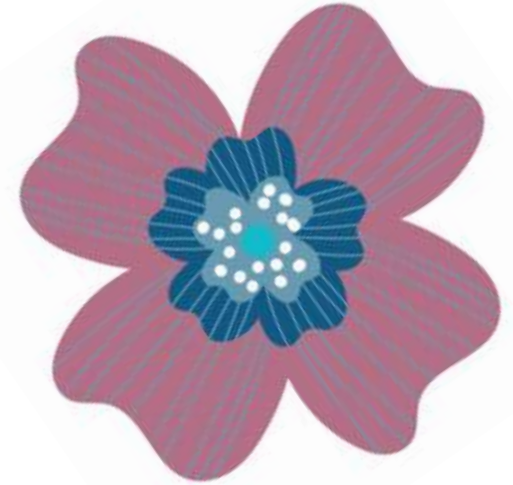

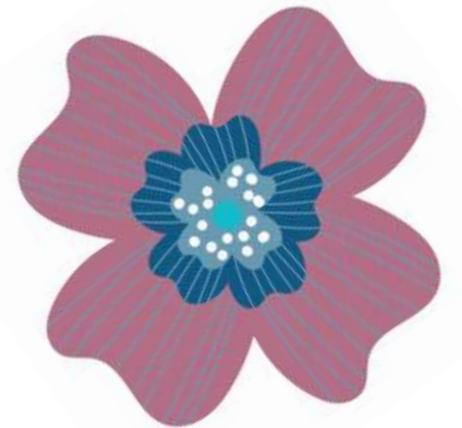

- **Assist** research planning & fundraising
- **Serve** as an advocacy tool
- **Provide** a monitoring tool for the field
- **Guide** SVRI grant-making



Why Change How Research Priorities are Set?

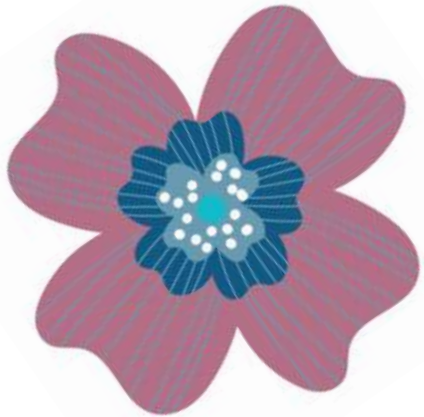
“For too long research agendas have been set by too few, often the loudest, most senior in the room.”



Our Approach to Priority Setting

We have adapted a method called CHNRI

- Measures **collective optimism** of participants
- **Advantages and disadvantages** of each research option become transparent, and the scores are intuitive
- **Transparently** presents opinions of the many on all research options: **limits personal bias & prevents a few individuals from dominating the process**
- Presents a **simple quantitative outcome**

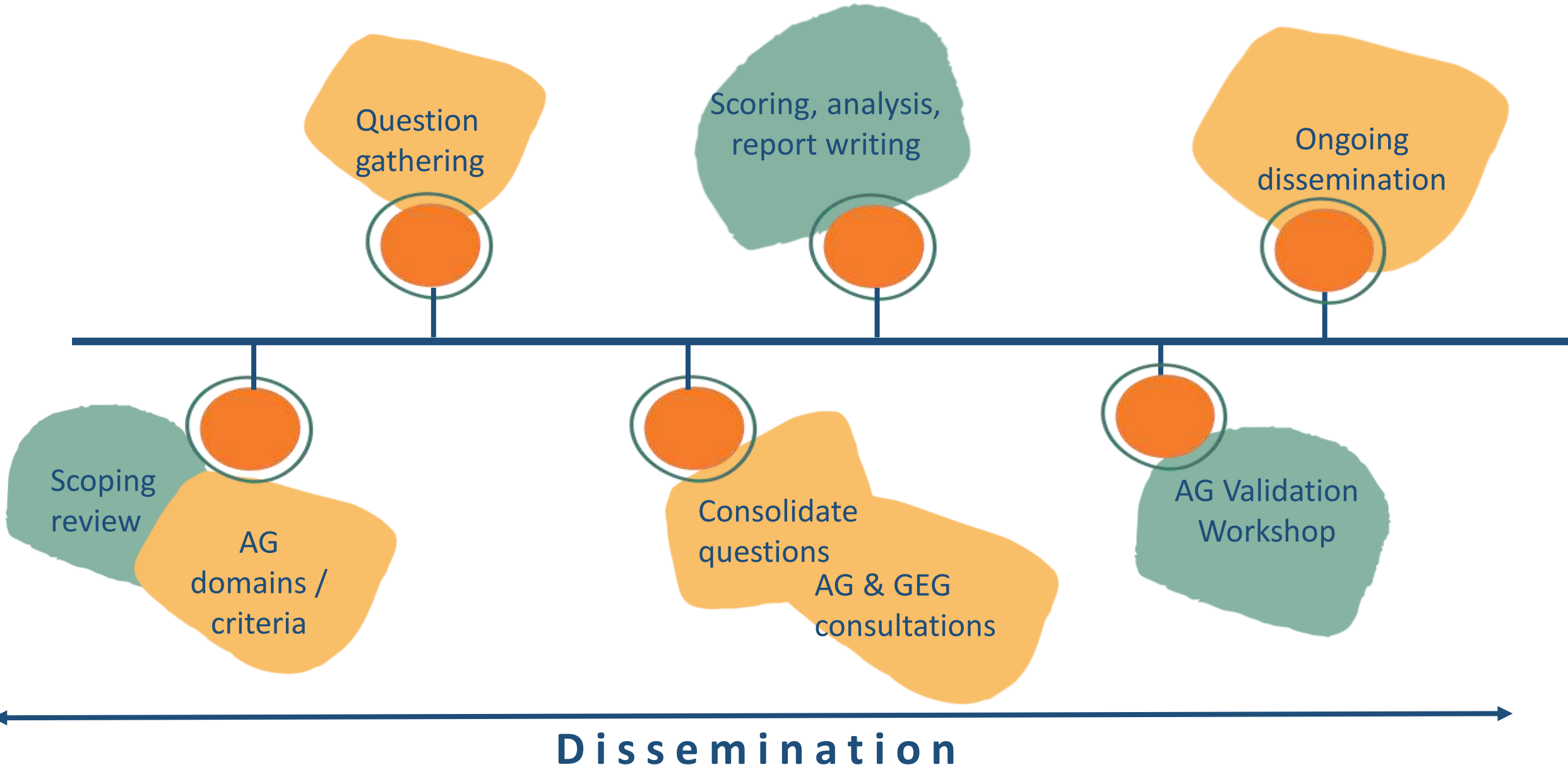
